

Rotary Charity Duck Race: Daniel Island, S. C.: Official Rules

1. Thirty-thousand (30,000) rubber ducks will be available for adoption and entered in the race. Ducks may be adopted from members of the Rotary Club of Daniel Island (the "Presenter") or from members of four other Rotary Clubs participating in the adoption of ducks (the "Participating Clubs") – the East Cooper Breakfast Rotary Club, the Summerville Rotary Club, the Rotary Club of Charleston, and the Rotary Club of North Charleston-Breakfast. Adoption forms may also be found, and adoptions processed online, at www.CharlestonDuckRace.com. The Presenter and Participating Clubs are seeking both individuals and businesses to adopt ducks for a suggested donation of \$10 per duck. Thirty-thousand (30,000) ducks will race regardless of the number adopted. Winners will be determined by the first adopted ducks to cross the finish line. Chances of winning depend on the total number of qualified entries.
2. Ducks will be dropped into the Wando River from the I-526 Mark Clark Bridge at approximately 11:30AM on June 12, 2010. Weather conditions or other interference may affect race time. The racecourse will be established by the Presenter and will end at the Daniel Island Waterfront Park Community Pier. Presenter reserves the right to change or alter the starting location or method at its discretion. If extreme circumstances beyond the reasonable control of Presenter prevent the completion of the race from occurring on June 12, 2010, winners will be determined by a random drawing of adopted duck numbers. Such drawing will be scheduled and conducted by Presenter.
3. All rubber ducks shall remain the property of the Presenter, and handling and possession of the ducks will be by Presenter only. Prior to the beginning of the race a unique number will be assigned to each duck adoption; each adoption will be assigned one number. Multiple duck adoptions on one entry form will be assigned multiple duck identification numbers. Each assigned number will correspond to a unique number affixed to each of the rubber ducks. Prizes will be awarded to the adopters whose names appear on the adoption forms corresponding to the qualifying ducks crossing the finish line in the order detailed in paragraph 5, below. A list of adopters and corresponding duck numbers, as of June 11, 2010, will be posted at the event prior to the start of the race.
4. Once ducks are dropped (see paragraph 2, above), they are on their own, except that Presenter reserves the right to manually maneuver ducks that deviate off the racecourse. Otherwise, no attempt will be made to free or interfere with any duck unless deemed necessary by the Presenter. A floating boom will be used to establish the open water racecourse and contain ducks while on the racecourse. The boom will be used to direct the ducks to a collection trap that will serve as the finish line. All ducks will be retrieved and removed from the water following the race conclusion.

The first 30 adopted ducks to cross the finish line will be deemed the consecutive winners. Prizes will be awarded per the following schedule:

An alternate prize of one-million dollars (US\$1,000,000.00) will be paid to the adopter of a duck which is identified in a contract ("Contract") between the Presenter and OddsOn Promotions (OOP) and which crosses the finish line in the position stated in the Contract. Payment of the one-million dollar prize will be made in an annuity of \$25,000 per year for 40 years, and is subject to all provisions, schedules, and specifications stated in the Contract; in no event will the Presenter or Participating Clubs, nor their officers nor members, be liable for the payment of the prize except through the mechanism of the Contract. If the duck identified as the winner according to the terms stated in the Contract has not been adopted the one-million dollar prize will not be awarded. Multiple prizes will not be awarded, and in the event the winner of the one-million dollar prize is also the winner of another prize (see above schedule), the adopter will be required to elect which prize to accept. Any prizes not accepted will revert to Presenter and will become part of the proceeds of the event. Presenter and Participating Clubs make no representation as to the ability of OOP to make the payments, and in any event a winner of this alternate prize may look only to OOP for payment.
6. Prize winners will be announced following the race. Prize winners must be 18 years of age and present valid identification. If a minor wins any of the prizes, that prize will be transferred to the minor's legal guardian. Winners do not need to be present to win. When necessary, winners will be notified by telephone or US Mail. If a winner does not claim his/her prize from Presenter within 30 days of the conclusion of the race, Presenter reserves the right to select an alternative prize winner through a random drawing of adoption numbers. A list of prize winners will be posted at www.CharlestonDuckRace.com within 48 hours of the conclusion of the race (or drawing, if needed). By adopting one or more ducks, adopters release Presenter and Participating Clubs and their officers, directors, members and other related entities from any and all liability with respect to prizes. All local, state and/or federal taxes are the sole responsibility of the winner. Required Federal and South Carolina taxes will be withheld from winnings. By adopting a duck, winners consent to the promotional use of their names and likenesses by the Presenter, Participating Clubs and/or by OOP without additional compensation.
7. The entry portion of each adoption form must be completely filled out and delivered to the Presenter or Participating Club, either physically or via electronic means on the website www.CharlestonDuckRace.com, by 5:00PM on June 11, 2010; any adoptions received by mail or electronically after that time may not be eligible for prizes. Also, no further adoptions will be accepted by any means after all 30,000 ducks have been adopted. If not all ducks have been adopted prior to race day, adoption forms and donations may be accepted at the event up until race time. Mailed adoption forms must be sent to the address found on the form. Entrants assume the risk of non-delivery of any entry. Completed forms can be delivered by hand to an authorized representative of the Presenter or of the Participating Clubs.
8. This event is subject to all federal, state and local laws and regulations and is void where prohibited by law. The Rotary Club of Daniel Island, Rotary Charity Duck Race and its logo are the property of Presenter and no other person or entity is authorized to copy or use them without the express written consent of the Presenter.
9. The Presenter and Participating Clubs reserve the right to distribute proceeds at their own discretion. For further information regarding the intended use of proceeds see www.CharlestonDuckRace.com.
10. No one is ineligible from participating in duck adoptions. Rotary Club of Daniel Island and Participating Club members, spouses, household members and all sponsors are eligible to win. The Presenter asserts the validity and integrity of the event, and welcomes anyone to witness the race.
